



What is a Political Resume?

A political resume or a political CV (curriculum vitae) is tailored for application in jobs in politics or civic groups. It focuses on your relevant strengths and accomplishments to engage the reader and give you a great impression.



Who Needs a Political CV?

This resume is most applicable for job seekers with public service experience who aspires to rise to a political role or leadership position in a civic organization.

Who Can Apply for Office?

In the US, the three most vital requirements to run for public office are educational background, experience, and citizenship/residency.



Candidates may have at least a Bachelor's diploma or higher. The most ideal degrees are political science, foreign affairs, anthropology, history, international relations, and public administration.

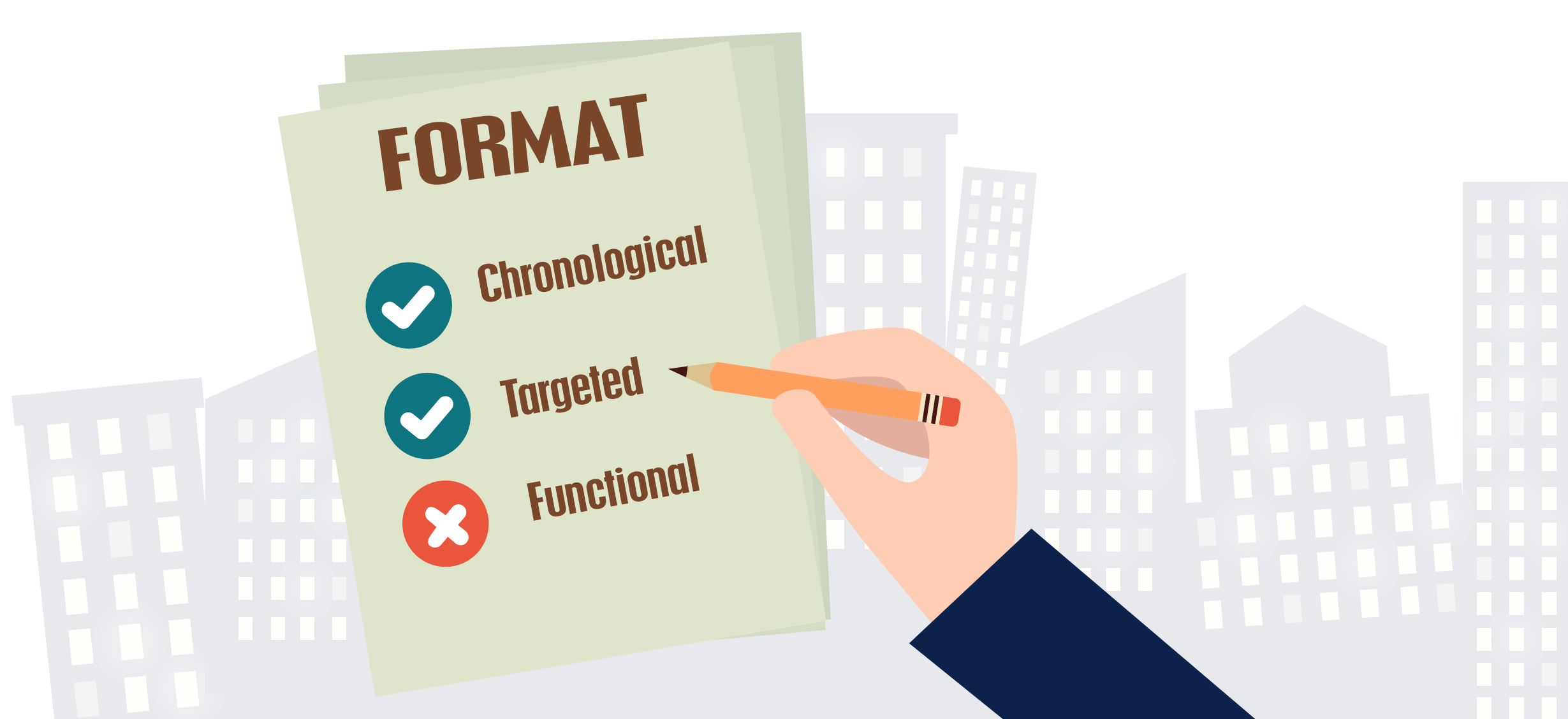


A candidate should have at least two to eight years related experience. Relevant experience may include affiliation with a political party (Democratic, Republican (GOP), Constitutional, Green Party, Libertarian, etc.) or volunteering for a local campaign and non-profit organization.



For aspiring senators additional requirements are at least 30 years old, a US citizen for at least nine years, and is a resident of the State they want to represent. The Senate consists of 100 members, with two senators coming from each state.

What Format Should You Use for a Political Candidate Resume?



Since recruiters spend only an average of six seconds per resume, the main goal for a resume for political appointment is to make it complete but readable. Politics entails you make a good impression among your constituents so build a resume that speaks volumes with clarity.

Resume experts recommend the chronological or targeted political CV format. For transparency, avoid using the functional format.

Which Sections Should Not Go Missing in Your Political Resume Format?

Professional Summary

This paragraph is the perfect place to highlight your leadership and organizational skills. State how you acquired them and cite notable events and accomplishments that sell your strengths.

Experience

Listing relevant roles held in reverse chronology is most preferred but if your focus is on relevance rather than time order, use the targeted format. Don't use the functional format since some see it as a deceptive move.

Areas of Expertise

In this section of a political resume, you add your platforms or the causes that you support. (Universal Health Care, Immigration Policies, Wealth Redistribution, Planned Parenthood, or Gun Control, etc.)

Activities

Discuss related civic projects such as volunteer experience, social or academic groups or other significant public service events attended. This shows their capacity for bigger scale public service roles.
